HR1 Examples

- \$50 million cut to Maternal Child Health
- Cuts \$1 billion from Community Health Centers
- \$269 million (37%) cut to public health preparedness grants
- Eliminates of the Prevention & Public Health Fund
- 30% cut to health professions training programs
- Eliminates 218,000 Head Start slots and child care subsidies for another 165,000 families

And That's Not All....

- 9 provisions to stop health reform implementation
- Total elimination of Title X Family Planning
- Provision to stop all funding to Planned Parenthood
- Climate Change
- Drilling
- Egypt/Libya Aid
- Guantanamo Bay Tribunals
